The **Instructor of Beginner Archers** training is a National Coaching Certification Program (NCCP) that deals with your development as an Instructor as well as delivering introductory archery skills to beginning archers.

Content of the course includes topics such as:

- qualities of the Instructor and Coaching philosophy
- managing a sport program
- young people and self esteem
- the beginning archer – instructing initial shooting skills
- planning a practice – logistics, safety, what to train
- giving instruction – observation and session plans
- making and dealing with ethical decisions
- case studies

Participants should be Archers with at least two years of experience and who are interested in instructing in the context of beginner archers of all ages. This includes all instructors who may be working in ABAM's Archery Development Program and Archery in the Schools Program, as well as other introductory and continuing instructional programs.

Certification

Successful candidates will be certified as NCCP Instructor of Beginning archers.

Training and Evaluation

The training workshop involves 18 hours of instruction and cooperative exercises presented over two days. This is followed by completion of workbook and portfolio assignments. Evaluation of candidates is in the form of presentations during the workshops and evaluation of workbook and portfolio assignments following the workshop.
